


# Paper Planes

Print out this activity and follow the directions on the following pages to create six of the racer characters in Disney's Planes.




Play the PLANES racer game with real paper planes. Print out the template pages, and follow the directions to create your racers. Then race them!



# Racer Came

Let's Race em'!

**TO PLAY:** Print the game board and paper plane templates. Follow the directions to create all six racer planes. **SET THE RACETRACK:** Cut two pieces of masking tape about 48 inches long. Place tape strips along the floor about 20 feet apart indicating one as the start line and one as the finish line. Line up the contestants behind the start line. Have each person throw their paper plane at the same time, the person whose plane crosses the finish line first WINS the round. Place a penny on the game board to indicate the WINNER for that round. Adjust your paper planes and continue to play until all the rounds are complete. The person who crosses the finish line first for four rounds is the WINNER!


